By the Mayor of Prattville, Alabama

WHEREAS, cancer is the second leading cause of death among children 15 years of age and younger. Childhood cancer rates have been on the rise for the past few decades and nearly 11,630 children under the age of 15 will be diagnosed with cancer in the United States this year; and

WHEREAS, there have been major advances in the treatment of cancer. Currently 80% of children diagnosed with cancer now survive 5 years or more, however survival rates do vary depending on the type of cancer; and

WHEREAS, children battling childhood cancer are cared for by loving families, friends, and communities who come together in their time of need; and

WHEREAS, cancers in children are often hard to recognize because symptoms can be very similar to illnesses and injuries that are very common. Parents are encouraged to have regular medical check-ups performed on their children and be aware of symptoms that do not go away; and

WHEREAS, each year far too many children and their families face the harmful effects of cancer. We should all take time to honor the many children who battle cancer and honor their families, friends, and medical professionals.
