



Proclamation

By the Mayor of Prattville, Alabama

WHEREAS, there are approximately 900,000 law enforcement officers serving in communities across the United States, including the dedicated members of the Prattville Police Department; and

WHEREAS, nearly 60,000 assaults against law enforcement officers are reported each year, resulting in approximately 16,000 injuries; and

WHEREAS, since the first recorded death in 1791, more than 20,000 law enforcement officers in the United States have made the ultimate sacrifice and been killed in the line of duty, including 1 member of the Prattville Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the names of these dedicated public servants are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C.; and

WHEREAS, new names of fallen heroes are being added to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial this spring. Currently, there are 20,789 names engraved on the walls of the Memorial; and

WHEREAS, the service and sacrifice of all officers killed in the line of duty will be honored during the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund's 29th Annual Candlelight Vigil, on the evening of May 13, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Candlelight Vigil is part of National Police Week.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Bill Gillespie Jr., Mayor of the City of Prattville, Alabama, do hereby recognize May 14 through May 20, 2017 as

National Police Week

and proclaim May 15, 2017 to be

Peace Officers Memorial Day

in the City of Prattville and call upon all Prattvillians to display the flag at half-staff from their homes and businesses on this day. Please join me in publicly saluting the service of our law enforcement officers in our community and in communities across the nation.
