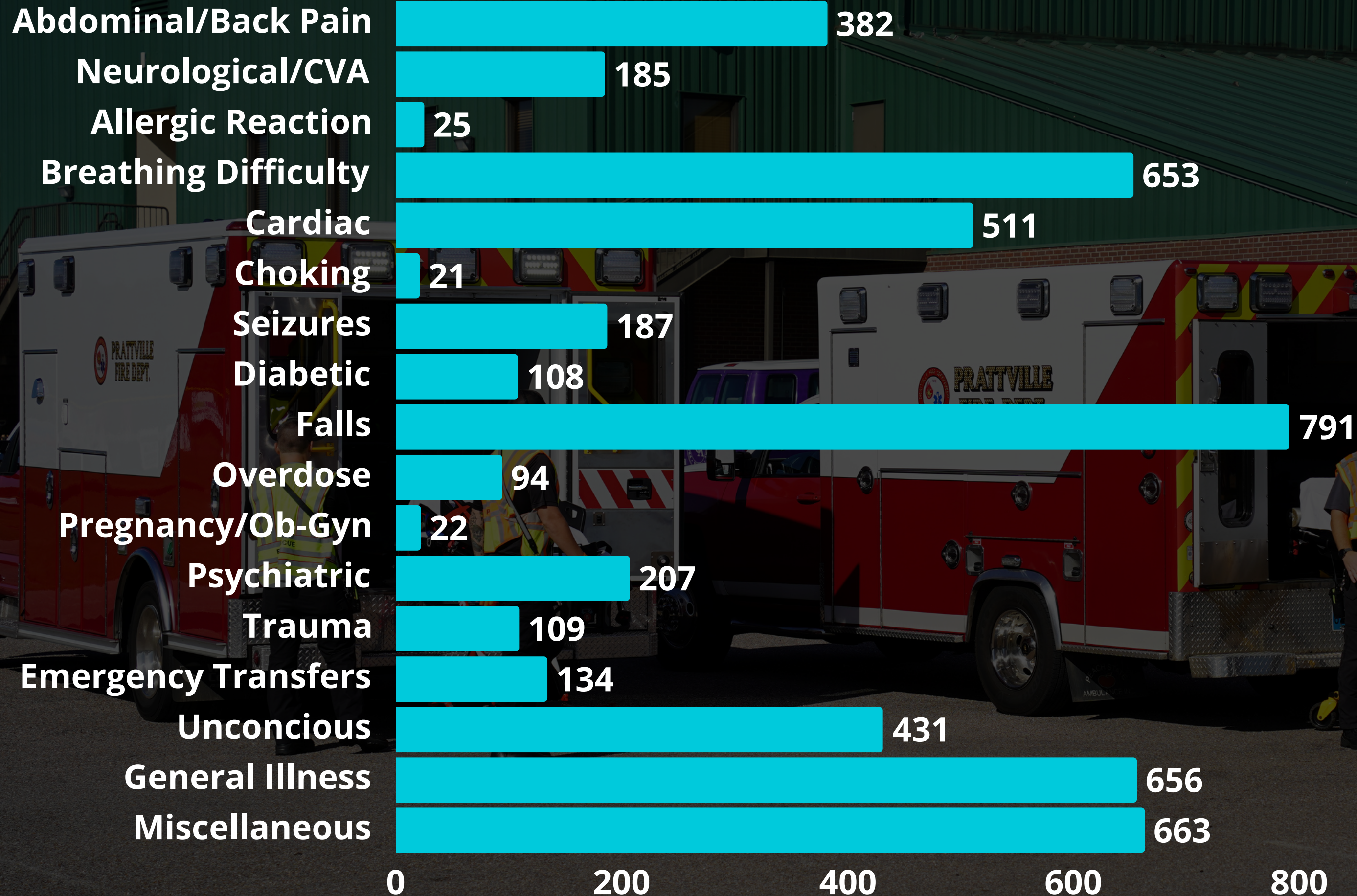

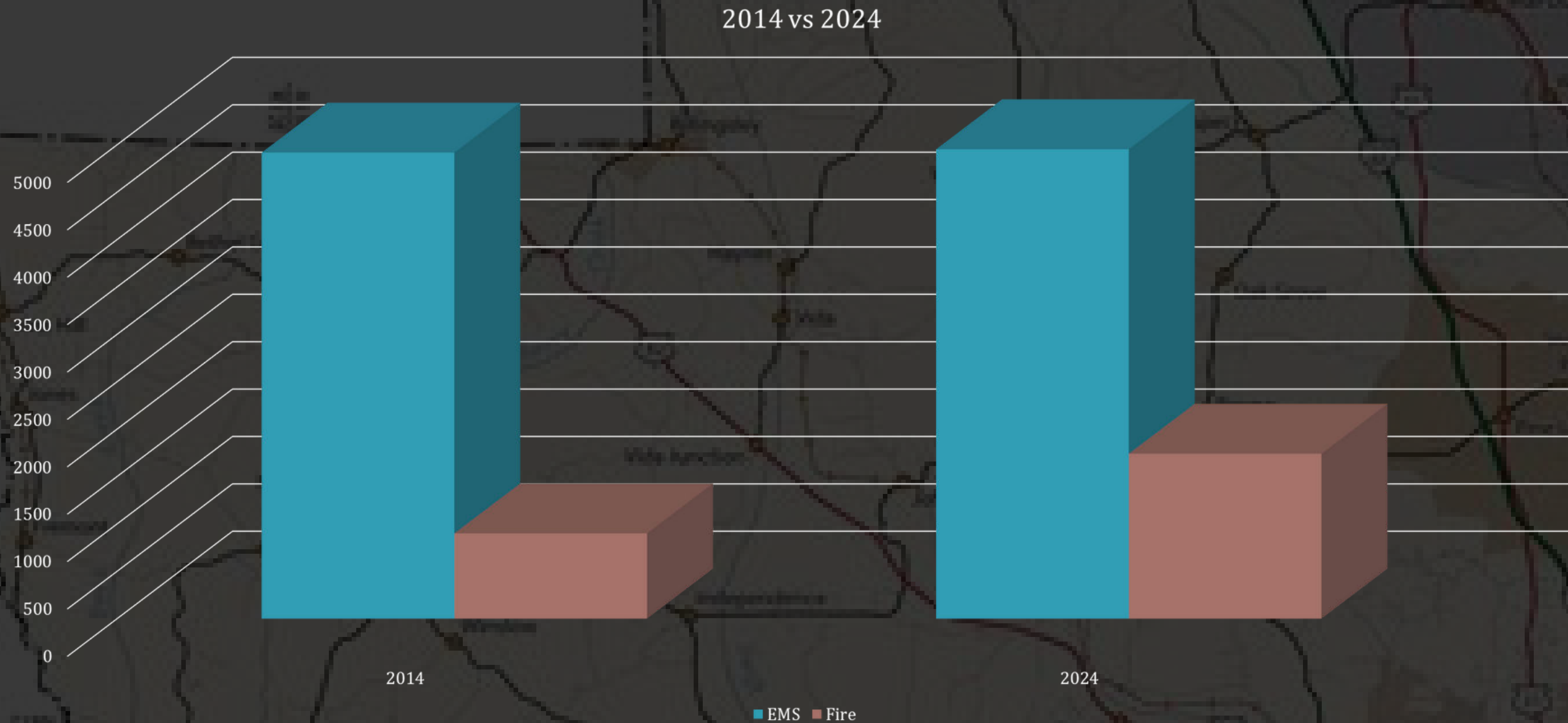

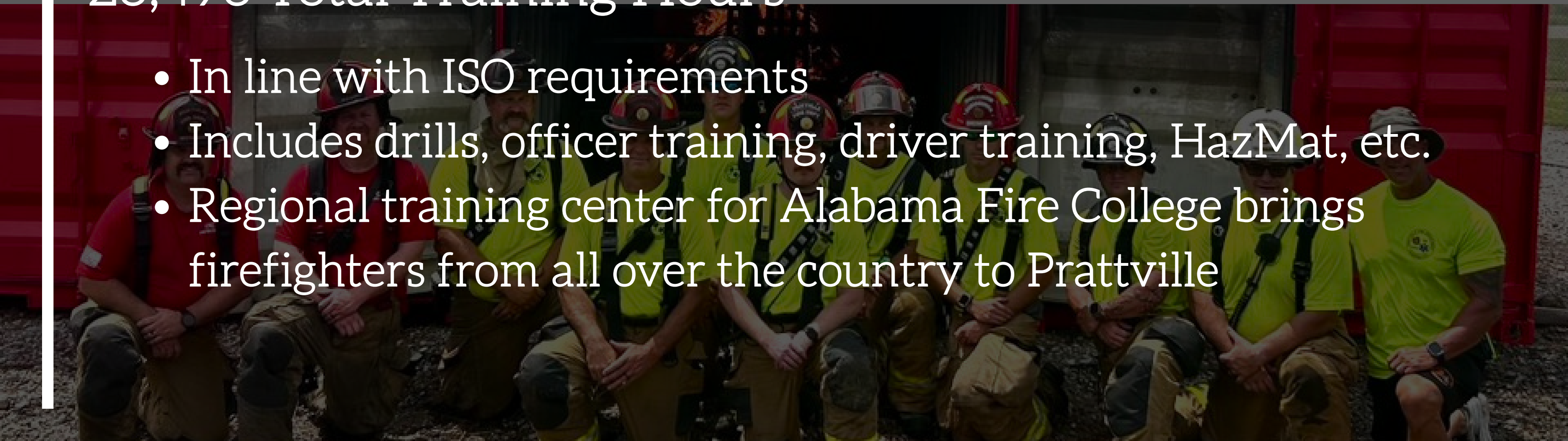

2025 Highlights



● Space Heater Safety

- Always plug space heaters directly into a wall outlet — never into an extension cord or power strip
- Keep at least 3 feet of clear space around all sides of space heaters
- Turn heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed
- Place heaters on a flat, stable surface and keep them away from curtains, furniture, and bedding
- Only use space heaters with automatic shut-off and tip-over protection



🔥 Safe Home Heating

- Never use ovens, stovetops, or grills to heat your home
- These can lead to house fires and dangerous carbon monoxide (CO) buildup
- Make sure all fuel-burning appliances are properly vented and in good working condition



- 🚒 Carbon Monoxide & Smoke Alarms
- Ensure you have working smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms on every level of your home
- Test alarms monthly and replace batteries as needed
- If your CO alarm sounds, get outside immediately and call 911

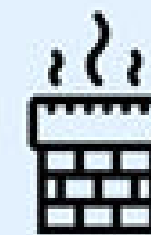

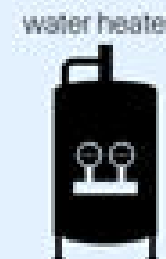

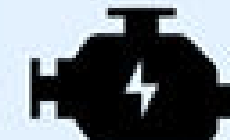
